Employee Duties and Responsibilities

- 1) Operates and maintains the county dog pound
 - a. Inside kennels are clean and disinfected daily
 - b. Outside kennels are cleaned, as needed
 - c. Feeds and water all dogs daily
 - d. Simple repairs are made, as needed
 - e. Greets the public for adoptions, reclaims and owner surrenders
 - f. Maintains a clean and presentable office area
 - g. Maintains all proper, legal paperwork and call for service log
 - h. Secures all dogs safely
 - i. Issues county dog licenses under the authorization of the County Auditor's Office
 - j. Maintains the property by mowing and weed eating

2) Dogs in the county

- a. Captures and impounds stray, unlicensed and uncontrolled dogs
- b. Cite owners with no dog tag(s)
- c. Capable of catching dogs by means of snare, rope or other humane means
- d. Impounds stray dogs not wearing valid registration tags
- e. Capable of lifting 100 pound dogs
- f. Ability to handle aggressive dogs

3) Veterinary Care

- a. Administer medications, as needed
- b. Access dogs for immediate medical attention
- c. Treat minor wounds and injuries
- d. Transport dog to veterinarian's office
- e. Perform or assist in euthanasia, as needed
- f. Dispose of dogs according to procedures

4) Operate and maintain a county vehicle

- a. Check oil and safety equipment
- b. Arrange for oil changes and basic maintenance
- c. Fuel vehicle and turn in receipts
- d. Maintain a clean, presentable vehicle
- e. Maintain a clean and sanitary dog box
- f. Follow all traffic laws

5) Other duties

- a. Investigates complaints of dog bite, abuse, neglect and other problems
- b. Appear in Municipal Court to testify on actions on dog cases
- c. Be on call, when assigned
- d. Attend meetings with the county commissioners, as needed
- e. Submit reports to commissioners, court officials or other law enforcement officers
- f. Manage dog waste
- g. Submit money from dog fees to appropriate agency
